

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

EVENT: 2021 National Squad Youth & Junior Squad Selection Trial

AUTHORITY: WINDSURFING ASSOCIATION OF HONG KONG (WAHK)

[DP] denotes a rule for which the penalty is at the discretion of the protest committee and may be less than disqualification.

[NP] denotes that a breach of this rule will not be grounds for a protest by a board. This change RRS 60.1.

1. RULES

- 1.1. The event will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2. The Class Rules of the participating class will apply.
- 1.3. Techno Class 293 Rules are amended - see HAITONG INTERNATIONAL 2020 HONG KONG WINDSURFING CIRCUIT Notice of Race # 8.1, and will be posted on the Official Notice Board.
- 1.4. Hong Kong Sailing Federation Prescriptions will apply, and will be posted on the Official Notice Board.
- 1.5. If there is a conflict between languages, the English text will take precedence.
- 1.6. If there is a conflict between NoR and the SIs, the SIs will take precedence. This changes RRS 63.7.

2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

- 2.1. Notices to competitors will be posted on the link below.

3. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 3.1. Any change to the Sailing Instructions will be posted not less than 60 minutes before the scheduled attention signal of the race in which it takes effect, except that any change to the schedule of the next day's racing will be posted not later than 90 minutes after the end of the last race of the day.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1. Signals made ashore will be displayed on the link below.

- . 4.2. When a signal is displayed over a division flag, it applies to that division only. This changes RRS Race Signals Preamble.
- . 4.3. When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes'. This changes RRS Race Signals AP.
- . 4.4. [DP] [NP] When flag Y is displayed, RRS 40 applies at all times while afloat. This changes RRS Part 4 Preamble.

5. RACE FORMAT

- . 5.1. Classes and divisions may race together depending on entry number.
- . 5.2. Classes and divisions shall race a maximum 4 races per day, 8 races per event.
- . 5.3. 3 races are required to validate the event for each division.
- . 5.4. If tropical cyclone warning signal number 3 or above, or black rainstorm warning signal is in force at 07:00 on the first day of the event, the event will be postponed. If tropical cyclone warning signal number 3 or above, or black rainstorm warning signal is in force at 08:00 on the second day of the event, the second day of the event will be cancelled. Information for the fallback day(s) (if any) will be announced via WAHK's website at <http://www.windsurfing.org.hk/tc/home/index.php> and Facebook account ASAP .
- . 5.5. If black rainstorm warning signal is in force after 07:00 on the first day of the event, or after 08:00 on the second day, the event will continue and the decision to start the race(s) will be at the discretion of the race committee.
- . 5.6. Races will not be started if the wind speed is less than 4 knots.

6. RACE SCHEDULE

6.1. The race schedule will be:

- 6.2. To alert boards that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, an orange flag will be displayed with 1 sound signal for at least 5 minutes before an attention signal is displayed.
- 6.3. 4 races may be sailed 'back to back'.

7. FLAGS

7.1. The flags will be:

8. RACING AREA

- . 8.1. The racing area is defined as an area extending 75 meters beyond course, including the starting line, the finishing line and their extensions, in which a board normally sails while racing.
- . 8.2. [DP] [NP] Boards not racing shall avoid the racing area.

9. COURSES

- . 9.1. Sailing Instructions Appendix1 show the courses, the order in which the marks are to be passed and the side on which each mark is to be left.
- . 9.2. The course to be sailed will be displayed by course flag and number flag.

10. MARKS

10.1. The marks will be:

Mark	Description
Starting Marks	Race Committee Signal Boat with orange flag/ Mark Boat / Yellow Cylindrical Buoy
Mark 1 – 4 and Gates	Yellow Cylindrical Buoys
Finishing Marks	Race Committee Signal Boat / Mark Boat / Orange Cylindrical Buoy with Blue Flag

11. THE START

11.1. Races will be started using the following signals. Times shall be taken from the visual signal(s); the absence of a sound signal shall be disregarded. This changes RRS 26 and Race Signals.

11.2. The starting line will be between orange flag on committee boat and starting mark.

11.3. A board starting later than 4 minutes after her starting signal will be scored DNS without a hearing. This changes RRS A4 and A5.

- 11.4. **[DP]** When a starting sequence is in progress, boards whose attention signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area. The starting area is defined as a rectangle 75 meters from the starting line and marks in all directions.
- 11.5. If flag I has been displayed, and any part of a board's hull, crew or equipment is in the triangle formed by the ends of the starting line and the first mark during the last minute before her starting signal, she shall thereafter sail from the course side across an extension to the pre-start side before starting, This change RRS 30.1.
- 11.6. When an individual recall has been signalled, or a board breaks RRS 30.3 or RRS 30.4, the race committee will display her sail number on the race committee signal boat before the first competitor has finished the race. Failure to display will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

12. THE FINISH

12.1. The finishing line will be between blue flags on the finishing marks.

13. TIME LIMITS AND TARGETS TIMES

13.1. Time limits and target times are in minutes for all Classes and Divisions and as follows:

Time Limit	Finish Window	Target Time
35	10	15-20

13.2. The 'Finish Window' determines the number of minutes allowed for competitors to finish after the first competition finishes. Boards failing to finish within the time stated in 'Finish Window' shall be scored DNF except those are scored DSQ, BFD, OCS, UFD, RET, RDG or DNE. This changes RRS 35, Appendix A4 and A5.

14. PROTEST AND REQUEST FOR REDRESS

- 14.1. Protest forms are available at the race office.
- 14.2. Protest and request for redress or reopening shall be delivered at the race office within the appropriate time limit.
- 14.3. **[DP] [NP]** Boards retiring from races shall complete a retirement declaration form at the race office before

the protest time limit.

- . 14.4. **[DP]** **[NP]** Boards taking a voluntary penalty shall complete the penalty acknowledgment form at the race office before the protest time limit.
- . 14.5. For each division, the protest time limit is 60 minutes after the last board of her division has finished the last race of the day or the race committee signals 'AP over A', whichever is later.
- . 14.6. Hearing schedule by groups, to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as a witness, will be posted on Facebook page (see link above) as soon as protests are received at the race office.
- . 14.7. Notices of protest by the race committee or protest committee will be posted on the Facebook page (see link above) to inform boards under RRS 61.1(b).
- . 14.8. Breaches of RRS 77 and rules in Sailing Instructions marked **[NP]** will not be grounds for a protest by a board. This changes RRS 60.1(a). Penalties for breaches marked **[DP]** are at the discretion of the protest committee and may be less than disqualification if the protest committee so decides.
- . 14.9. On the last day of the event, a request for redress based on protest committee shall be delivered no later than 30 minutes after the decision was posted. This change RRS 62.2.
- . 14.10. On the last day of the event, a request for reopening a hearing shall be delivered within the protest time limit if the requesting party was informed of the decision on the previous day or no later than 30 minutes after the requesting party was informed of the decision on that day. This changed RRS 66.
- . 14.11. Protest time limits, hearing schedules and decisions will be posted on the Official Notice Board.

15. SCORING

- . 15.1. Scoring will be according to the RRS Appendix A and B8.
- . 15.2. For Youth Boys Division and Youth Girls Division in Techno 293 Class, the race score shall be the finishing place in Techno 293 Class Youth Division.
- . 15.3. When 3 or less races have been completed, the series score shall be the total of her race scores. When 4 or more races have been completed, the series score shall be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score. This changes RRS Appendix A2.

15.4. To request correction of an alleged error in the posted results, a board shall complete a scoring review form available at the race office.

[DP] [NP] SAFETY REGULATION 16.1 Competitor retiring before finishing shall inform the race committee (race committee boats or rescue boats) as soon as possible. If this is not possible, the competitor shall inform the race office.

[DP] EQUIPMENT AND EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

18.1 A board or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the Class Rules and Sailing Instructions. On the water, a board can be instructed by the race committee to proceed immediately to the inspection area for inspection.

19. [DP] IDENTIFICATION

19.1. The sail identification will be:

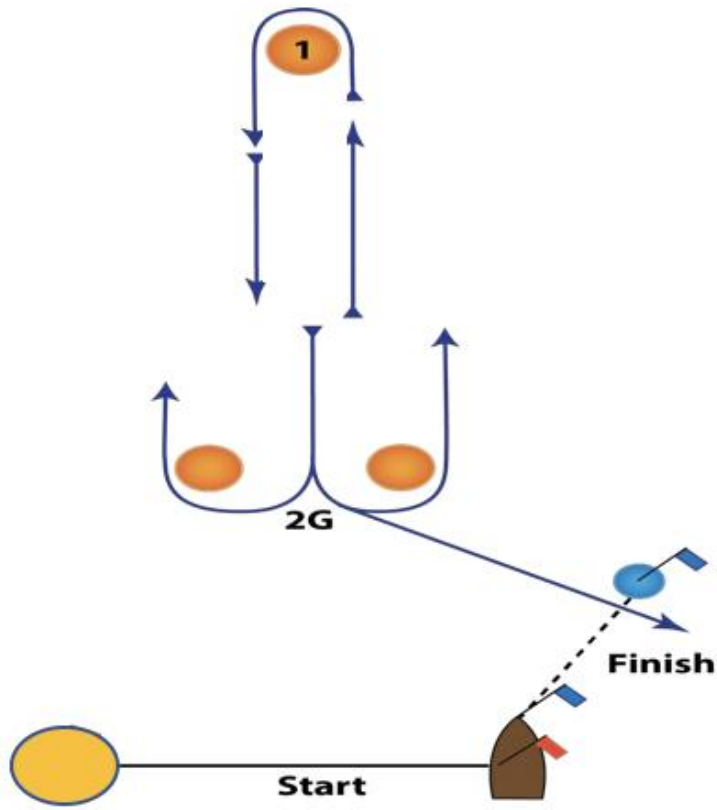

20. [DP] [NP] TRASH DISPOSAL

20.1. As sailors, we seek to protect and restore our oceans and coastal waters. Boards shall not intentionally put trash in the water. Trash may be placed aboard coach, support and race committee boats. This changes RRS 55.
